Value of the month – our value of the month is understanding.

Dear parents and guardians,

We have had such a good start to our new term and the children have been working with some exciting books, which in turn has supported a wide range of subjects and their topic for the half term.



Attendance – everyday counts! Our current whole school attendance for the last two weeks is 95%! Good attendance is vital for all children, and we work to ensure all classes achieve that. The knowledge and skills that your child gains will support their achievements over time.

We are continuing to focus on two areas around attendance:

- those who persistently arrive late during the week. We are working together to remove the barriers to arriving on time.
- those who are deemed persistently absent from school.
 Gov.uk describes this, as those who have had more than 10 days away from school since the start of term.

Mindful parking and consideration – my team and I are deeply saddened at recent events that took place outside our school with regard to parking and consideration of others. You will have received a ParentMail during the week and we ask that you read and digest the content, especially about recording of incidents and use of them. Blocking the school entrance or local resident's drives, could put children and adults at risk, for example if the emergency services could not get through.

Odd Socks Day (14th November 2022) – as part of our Anti Bullying Week or as we like to call it 'friendship week', the children will be able to wear odd socks for the day! It is a great way to celebrate what makes us unique in Anti-Bullying Week! Odd Socks Day is delivered in partnership with CBeebies and CBBC star Andy Day and his band, Andy and the Odd Socks.

Children in Need – is being held on Friday 18th November and our children can dress up in their pyjamas and dressing gown for the day! They will need appropriate footwear and a coat, as they will be going outside and moving around school. Exercise for children - research indicates that inactive children are likely to become inactive adults, putting young people at risk of developing conditions as they grow up and become adults.
