The school council felt that they would like to go and see the local government and we are working to arrange a trip to the Town Hall.

Each child took part in the performance, regardless of need, and each class had their day. A special 'shout out' goes to Maple, as the sound system broke down and in true West End style – 'the show went on'. We are so very proud of every child and how much they have 'grown' since they started in September. They were able to remember their lines, sing all the songs, perform, narrate, and manage stage directions and so much more. It was also lovely to get back to normal and have parents and guardians share the joy of a live performance.

We had a wonderful visitor in for Year Two, who came in to spend the day with them talking about the Great Fire of London and also the key people who were living at that time and wrote accounts of that time. The children had a carousel of activities and opportunities to work with our visitor and really enjoyed the experience. The visitor certainly brought history to life!

- Year 1 Year 1 are currently reading the story 'Bear Shaped', this is based on a true story about a boy who loses his teddy and is left feeling empty inside. In maths we are looking at doubling and halving, children have used various manipulatives to show their understanding.

This week all our Year 1 classes have performed their Nativities to parents. All of Year 1 have been amazing, lovely acting and wonderful singing. We are proud of each and every one of our children.
