Partnership working with families is vital to ensure your child attends school, optimises their learning experiences and achieve their full potential. Updates from year groups:

• **Nursery & Reception** – produce a wonderful weekly newsletter with all the exciting information about what they are working on and how you can best support your child during the week.

- **Year 1** In English we have read the story '<u>Traction Man</u>' and children have created their own comic book strips. They have learnt how to use an exclamation mark in their writing. In maths we have been adding and subtracting numbers up to 20.
- Believe it or not, Year One were visited by Nurse Florence Nightingale this week! She told her <u>life</u>
 story and captivated the children's imaginations and took them back to the 1800's. Children had fun
 making their own lamps.







• Year 2 – Our feet may be on the icy ground, but our heads are amongst the stars this January!
