Dear parents and guardians,

Our first round of extra-curricular clubs has been a huge success. Whether they joined art, reading, computing, the music club, multi-sports or one of our many other clubs, the children have been engaged and having fun whilst furthering their learning. These clubs run from 3.40 p.m. until 4.10 p.m. and will be for every half term.

We have an amazing provision running again this year, Exercise Behaviour with Pete. He works with our pupils to help with behaviour and recognising green, amber and red choices with their choices spaceship. Each class have created their own choices spaceship in line with our behaviour policy and our pupils seem to be recognising red, amber and green choices and are able to make green choices in their day. Maybe ask your child about their class' choices spaceship?

Updates from year groups:

- **Nursery & Reception** produce a wonderful weekly newsletter with all the exciting information about what they are working on and how you can best support your child during the week.
- Year One Year One have had a busy fortnight, we have been reading an amazing book called 'Ruby's Worry'. Ruby learns how to make her worries disappear after realising other people have worries too. Our writing focus has been around diary entries; we have been writing in the first person. In maths we have been estimating and ordering numbers to 10.

In science Year 1 had a lot of fun labelling the parts of their bodies and singing 'heads, shoulders knees and toes'.

• Year Two - As September draws to a close, we are still as energised as a Jean Michael Basquiat painting! We made some pastel and charcoal portraits in his vibrant style. Our English text – 'Can I build another me?' - has been equally extraordinary! We are using conjunctions and noun phrases to write non-chronological reports about ourselves.
