Dear parents and guardians,

We have had such a good start to our new term and the children have been working with some exciting books, which in turn has supported a wide range of subjects and their topic for the half term.

Mindful parking and consideration – my team and I are deeply saddened at recent events that took place outside our school with regard to parking and consideration of others. Blocking the school entrance or local resident's drives, could put children and adults at risk, if the emergency services could not get through. We are role models to our children and when they see poor behaviour choices or physical interactions between parents, this can cause trauma in young children or lead them to think that is how situations should be dealt with in this way.

Odd Socks Day (13th November 2023) – as part of our Anti Bullying Week or as we like to call it 'friendship week', the children will be able to wear odd socks for the day! It is a great way to celebrate what makes us unique in Anti-Bullying Week! Odd Socks Day is delivered in partnership with CBeebies and CBBC star Andy Day and his band, Andy and the Odd Socks.

Updates from year groups:

- Nursery & Reception produce a wonderful weekly newsletter with all the exciting information about what they are working on and how you can best support your child during the week.
- Year 1 have been reading the book <u>Dogger</u> this week. We have learnt all about using adjectives to describe a character. We have created a poster all about 'Dogger' and used adjectives to describe him in order to help find him!

In maths the children have been learning all about equality and balance and making equivalent values using addition and subtraction. The children have learnt all about Diwali in RE in which they have made rangoli patterns, henna designs, and Diwali cards. They have also learnt all about Remembrance Day in history and designed poppies to signify the soldiers who have fought and died in previous world wars and other significant battles.
